#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

AND IF I DON'T BEHAVE THEN WHAT- is such a surprise.

It presents a lyrical, brutally raw, exquisitely poetic journey into the life of a woman.

I first met and worked with Iva Brdar in 2018, and found the discovery of her words, and their possibilities, fascinating- provocative and poignant. Unexpected, light, and heavy at the same time. Her work is that of a poet and a realist.

When I first read this play—I thought immediately of the actress/performer Cynthia Ettinger- as the one person I knew could help to reveal the layershelp us to understand and explore the power and the potentiality of this work.

My second thought- (with the aid of designer Richard Hoover, a long-time member of this company) was to approach the collective brain-heart and humanity housed at Open Fist Theatre - to aim and dream to share this piece in Los Angeles- (a place I always lovingly consider my artistic home.)

The play is written as a long tone poem (with no punctuation) to be discovered upon articulation- on coining- this process has enabled us to open up the images to excavate the meaning of the words – but we know -we need you--very much – and this play necessitates the experiential opportunity to share the words with you – to see how they sit with you. As we go.

These moments of fragile humanity- of purpose - of fractures of eloquence-I hope - present an opportunity to come together. To recall the glistening moments in our collective past(s) while sharing a strength- breathing together- in a space again. Inhale and exhale.

Life is as quick as a breath.

These past three years have highlighted the tenuous nature - of everything. Being together -once again- in a theatre—connects us-- to our inner tenacities.

I am so grateful you have come to share this journey with us.
