

DeJuan Christopher (Leroy) is excited to make his debut with the Echo. His portrayal of Roosevelt Hicks in August Wilson's Radio Golf earned DeJuan nominations for a NAACP Theatre Award as Best Supporting Actor

and a StageSceneLA Award for Outstanding Featured Performance in a Drama. DeJuan starred in the acclaimed short film Malleable, executively produced by Lena Waithe, which premiered at Tribeca Film Festival and can be seen on Hulu. DeJuan can be seen in an upcoming AT&T commercial alongside Emmy and Golden Globe winner Sarah Paulson.



Kacie Rogers (Berta) is a two-time NAACP Awardwinning writer, producer, and actor. She co-founded Bottle Tree Theatre Co. in 2024, producing acclaimed work in Los Angeles and at the Edinburgh Fringe. Her

award-winning short film SHOUT screened in over 10 cities across two countries. She has two films in development, including X Marks the Spot, winner of the Big Indie Fellowship at the Austin Film Festival. Her playwriting credits include Oladele or The Forgotten Song (IAMA New Works Festival) and I Sell Windows (Outside In, Edinburgh Fringe), developed through the Shay Fellowship. A graduate of AMDA, Kacie has worked with leading companies including The Robey Theatre Co., IAMA, The Getty Villa, The Echo, The Geffen, and Center Theatre Group, where her self-written short Ol' Auntie Jemmie streamed to audiences. On screen, she has appeared in several television shows, including Curb Your Enthusiasm and Grace & Frankie.

Angelica Chéri (Playwright) is a playwright, bookwriter & lyricist, screenwriter and poet. Her plays include The Seeds of Abraham (Billie Holiday Theatre), The Sting of White Roses (National Black Theatre Festival) and Crowndation (National Black Theatre), Berta, Berta (Contemporary American Theatre Festival; Everyman Theatre) and The Wiring & the Switches (Geffen Writers Group). Angelica

and collaborator Ross Baum received the Richard Rodgers Award for their musical Gun & Powder (Signature Theatre). Angelica is cowriter of the Highway to Heaven series reboot on the Lifetime Network and story producer for Season 2 of Dear... on Apple TV+. Angelica received her BA in Theatre from UCLA, MFA in Playwriting from Columbia University and MFA in Musical Theatre Writing from NYU.

Andi Chapman (Director) is the Associate Artistic Director of The Ebony Repertory Theatre. Her Directing credits include: Macbeth, Toni Morrison's The Bluest Eye at A Noise Within Theatre. This Bright Wilderness ( A celebration of Black Theater at the Mark Taper Forum), SHE, World Premiere at the Anteaus Theatre; BOTH AND, World Premiere at The Boston Court Theatre & The Wallis Theatre. The critically acclaimed Native Son, Anteaus & Kirk Douglas Theatre, Garnering Best Director nominations (Stage Raw & Broadway World). Ebony Repertory Theatre's The Gospel at Colonus, which Garnered 14 Ovation Nominations including Best Play and Best Play Direction, and won the NAACP Theatre Award of 2016 for Best Production. Ms. Chapman is a graduate The Yale School of Drama, The AFI DWW, and is a participant in the Lincoln Center Director's Lab.

Dedicated to nurturing writers and producing new work, the Echo, over its 27 years, has presented 101 Los Angeles premiere productions. Of these, 81 were world premieres and of those, 52 were commissions. Most recently the company produced One Jewish Boy by Stephen Laughton, Clarkston by Samuel D. Hunter, LADCC award Best Writing, Abby Rosebrock's Dido of Idaho, two LADCC awards, How It's Gon' Be by JuCoby Johnson, Bernardo Cubria's Crabs In A Bucket, LADCC award Best Writing, The Thin Place by Lucas Hnath and Jessica Goldberg's BABE, the LADDC award Best Writing, Hooded by Tearrance Arvelle Chisholm, and Chiara Atik's Poor Clare, which won 8 LADCC Awards. We were also given the Margaret Harford Award for Excellence in Theater by the LADCC. Anthony Brynes of KCRW said: "Echo theatre company is on a fierce journey. They are choosing plays that are consistently challenging and all have a deep conscience... If you wanted to pick one small theatre to add to your cultural roster -Echo is the consistent favorite."
