Director's Notes:

A nation builds a political fortress, for the protection of its people, but what happens when the elements from which the nation forges this fortress do not reflect its' humanity? With the extreme religiosity of the Puritans of the 1600's in Salem, Mass., fear drove friends to name a neighbor as a witch to save themselves from death. The terror of the Nazi regime, or desire to climb within its social strata, again saw neighbors turning on neighbors. In the 1950's, fear cloaked itself in "patriotism" as America's government stripped citizens of their livelihood because of their beliefs. Today, in this nation founded by immigrants, where a hundred different languages are spoken each day, speaking something other than English, in front of the wrong person, can result in a visit from authorities. Is there a better time to throw light on this dark aspect of human nature?
