A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Setting forth on this adventure, I fully recognized the inherent folly of it all. How to do a play of "ideas" and debate in this escapist age? How to portray the internal life of a solo character and her search for "awakening"? How to appeal to a general audience, many of whom will have no initial interest in the subject, and at the same time, to those already committed to certain spiritual practices. How to find an audience, in both cases, open to these existential ideas? How to find a middle ground between not too technical and not too simplistic?

But "Fools rush in...". I'm an old codger with probably very little time left "to strut and fret my hour upon the stage," so if not now, then when?

Elephant Shavings represents a response to over 60 years of "spiritual" adventures. It's not a play about religion, but rather about the quest to discover one's true nature... and the nature of life itself. Does it have a meaning? Does it have a purpose? How do I fit into the whole? And who is this "I"? How about destiny versus free will? These all seem to be questions that go beyond the boundaries of organized religions, but are central to our very existence.

The play draws 80% from true anecdotes and experiences, as well as the teachings of a number of extraordinary beings. To them I am most grateful.

As I began writing, I was awakened nightly, inundated with memories of events, teachings and experiences... far too many to be incorporated in any reasonable theatre piece. The very first rough draft probably would have run six or seven hours! As it is, the performance you will see you tonight/today is rather a brief overview and consideration of a few of these ideas. I'm hoping that this will not just be a "niche piece," but rather one which might have larger appeal. But then again, "Fools rush in...!"

DENISE BLASOR Pearl/Costume Designer

Denise is a Puerto Rican actor, stage and film director, designer and podcast writer/director/actor and producer. DIANA CIGNONI Lizzie

Diana is a German-American filmmaker who got a start in acting at an early age, working at the HB Studio in New York. She later moved to Los Angeles where she studied with teacher Charlie Laughton, Al Pacino's life-long mentor and friend, while performing in award-winning productions of plays by Bertolt Brecht, Samuel Beckett and most recently starring in Harold Pinter's A Kind of Alaska and Brian Friel's Faith Healer at the Odyssey. It was in Los Angeles that she developed into a thoughtful independent writer and filmmaker, and her work has been recognized in multiple film festivals in the United State and Europe. 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
