I recently received a letter from a dear friend of mine on the East Coast. As she read "Team of Rivals, the Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln" by Doris Kearns Goodwin, my friend wrote:

"When I read how much the theater did for Lincoln, my heart went immediately to you."

Interestingly enough, I started reading Lincoln's biography years ago and still haven't finished it because most of my time is spent reading plays now. But my friend shared with me a section from the book:

"Lincoln's ability to retain his emotional balance in such difficult situations was rooted in an acute self-awareness and an enormous capacity to dispel anxiety in constructive ways. In the most difficult moments of his presidency, nothing provided Lincoln greater respite and renewal than to immerse himself in a play at either Grover's or Ford's. Leonard Grover estimated that Lincoln had visited his theater 'more than a hundred times' during his four years as president. . .

It gave him an hour or two from worry. The drama drew his mind into other channels of thought, afforded him the most entire relief . . . he was transported into a realm far from the troubling events that filled the rest of his waking hours . . .

Lincoln seated in his presidential box could enjoy the communal experience which allowed him to feel the pulse of the people."

Here is to all of us finding that respite and renewal through our shared communal experience of live theatre.

She has served on grant panels for the county and city and as a speaker/panelist for the SRO Theatre Conference at USC on Best Practices, the Technical Theatre Conference about the role of a director, and more. She represented ICT as a National Participant for the Listening Post Project with Johns Hopkins University and was named "Enterprising Woman in the Arts" in Long Beach. caryn was honored with the "We Can Do It" Award

from the Long Beach Rosie the Riveter Foundation and nominated as an Amazing Woman in the Arts. She taught college for more than 25 years and received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Long Beach City College. She served as a Dramaturgical Responder for the graduate playwriting students at USC and served as Vice Chair for the LA Producers League for Large Theatres. In 2016 she was the keynote speaker at the Disneyland Hotel for INTIX. That same year she accepted the LA Drama Critics Circle Award for Outstanding Season and was recognized as a 2016 Community Hero by the African American History & Culture Foundation. In 2018 caryn was named Distinguished Alumna from the College of the Arts at California State University, Long Beach. Prior to the pandemic, she returned to teaching Nonprofit Arts Management at CSU, Fullerton. Recently she was honored to be included on the Long Beach City College Hall of Fame and to receive a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Long Beach NAACP. Most recently it was a privilege to serve as Mace Marshall for UC Irvine's graduates from the School of Arts, School of Education, and School of Physical Sciences.
