

Note from the Author

The word 'archive' often triggers images of dingy old storage spaces and damp basements; shelves heaving with dusty forgotten documents. Yet, within such repositories, secret treasures often lie concealed.

The Nazis were obsessive record keepers. They understood, only too well, how useful an accurately kept archive would be in proving to their superiors that they were getting the job done. By the time they were defeated in 1945 they had accumulated thousands of folders, storage boxes and ledgers which, when put together in one place, would fill 16 miles of shelves. Ironically, of course, such scrupulous attention to bureaucratic detail was very useful to the prosecutors of the Nuremberg trials. About 700 million pages of the Nazis' self-incriminating documents were used as evidence against them.

What you'll hear tonight is inspired by an archive of a very different nature: the Edmund S Muskie Archive, at Bates College in Maine to be precise, the online version of which I happened upon one night. The creator of that archive is retired history Professor and author, Steven Hochstadt. In 1989, after hearing stories from his grandmother, Steve, then a young history teacher, began tracking down and interviewing elderly German and Austrian Jews who had something extraordinary in common. They had all evaded the Nazi death camps, by escaping from Europe to the one country in the world whose doors were wide open to them.

That safe haven was not the United States, which had such strict rules for entry in the 1930s that most refugees had no hope of passing the test. Nor was it the United Kingdom; the Brits only wanted to help refugees who were unlikely to threaten British jobs, or who could fill specific shortages, like housekeepers.

No, the unlikely place that opened its arms freely to the Jews was Shanghai, in China.

Exodus: The Shanghai Jews is a collection of personal stories of resilience, ingenuity, and survival. And we only get to hear these stories because someone decided to record on tape this particular piece of history, while the eye witnesses to it were still alive. Keeping an account, and placing it in a public archive, is important, and a gift. It enriches our knowledge of history by shining a light on hidden narratives. Steven Hochstadt decided to make recordings and transcribe these accounts of his life's work, and because of that we are able to give voice to some of the 20,000 people that China helped to save.

Ms. Loewenberg also serves as host and is the Executive Producer of LATW's nationally distributed syndicated radio series, "L.A. Theatre Works," broadcast on NPR stations nationwide. A graduate of Sarah Lawrence College, she has served on innumerable boards and panels, including the National Endowment for the Arts, California Arts Council, The Fund for Independence in Journalism in Washington D.C., and was co-chair of the League of Producers and Theatres of Greater Los Angeles. From 1996-2002, Ms. Loewenberg served during the Clinton administration on the Board of Directors for Federal Prison Industries, a presidential appointment, and served for several years as a member of the regional panel of the President's Commission on White House Fellows. She is a former member of the Board of Directors of The Center for Public Integrity having served 20 years, and a Fellow of the Los Angeles Institute for the Humanities at USC. Ms. Loewenberg is the author of a number of articles that have appeared in American Theatre Magazine, The Los Angeles Times, and various professional journals.
