From the Artistic Director

I'm so honored to lead The Fountain Theatre and to finally direct on the historic Deborah Culver Lawlor stage! I wanted to program and direct Fly Me to the Sun because it, in many ways, represents both the beautiful past and the exciting future of our intimate and powerful theatre company on Fountain Avenue. We remain committed to presenting work that confronts the issues of our world by celebrating the deepest parts of our shared humanity.

Two years ago, Alex Levy at 1st Stage in Tysons, VA connected me with Brian Quijada (BQ), setting us on a journey of collaboration that traversed memories, cultures, generational divides, a few tears, a lot of laughs, and some beautiful discoveries.

BQ and I deeply connected over the shared experience of being raised by grandmothers at pivotal points throughout our adolescence. I had the privilege of being raised with both my grandmothers and great-grandmothers—an embarrassment of generational riches! It was these four women (Virginia Morada, Francisca Olosan, Wilkey Mae Page, Viola Andrews) who embedded some of my deepest life lessons. Their words, philosophies, and beliefs remain a core part of who I am.

My relationship with my grandmothers, much like BQ's relationship with Abuela Julia, was transformational because these women framed history, culture, and values in ways that our parents could not. For first and second generation Americans these experiences connect us to homelands and people that often feel intangible throughout youth, but are connections that become vital in adulthood.

The history of Salvadoran Americans is particularly important and unique right now as our nation actively interrogates the history—and future—of immigration/migration of the Latine diaspora. A twelve-year civil war (financed by the United States) resulted in the deaths of over 75,000 people and incited the migration of over one million Salvadorans. Today, California is home to the largest population of Salvadorans outside of El Salvador and Los Angeles has a vibrant Salvadoran community who contribute significantly to the economic and cultural landscape of our city. Salvadorans and the entire Latine community remind us that immigrants make our country, and city, great!

BQ's abuelita—much like my lolas and grandmothers—entreats us to think deeply about what to value as Americans, asking us to be critical of what the American dream is, and who the beneficiaries of that dream really are. These women whose immigration/migration to the US was often rife with trauma and hardship navigate capitalism, racism, sexism, and ageism as part of their new American lives. Pathways towards citizenship have always been a core part of the American dream, but what happens when you discover there isn't a place for you in that dream?

BQ and I discovered through this creative process that our collective imagination might be the vehicle to honor and embody those who keep speaking to us and through us. In honor of all of our grandmothers, I hope you'll join us upstairs for a post-show treat inspired by the play. Make a friend and share a memory of your own grandmother, good, bad, or, simply unexpected.



Everything is done beautifully. Total artistry. The directing, acting, and sets are consistently excellent. I've never seen a show that I didn't either love or like. Now that's quite a track record. But what's equally remarkable is the consistent sensitivity and timeliness of the plays presented. Every play The Fountain mounts is relevant and thought-provoking. My friends and I love to discuss the plays after the show, whether we do it on the sidewalk or up in the cafe."

"But for me, The Fountain is more than a theatre, it is a community. Everyone greets me by name and makes me feel welcome. It's a very personal place, not an institution. And that warmth, that personal connection is very unique, and refreshing. Everything at The Fountain seems to come from the heart."

Barbara's philanthropy is guided by a simple principle that she learned from her parents: "I'm a firm believer in leaving the world a better place than I found it. If I see a need, I try to fill it. If I see a problem, I try to fix it. And I always encourage people to join me."

Susan Stockel was a tremendous suppporter of theatre both in Los Angeles and New York. Susan became filled with excitement when speaking about theatre — especially when describing a play that truly touched her. Susan's love for theatre found her frequently traveling to New York, London and beyond to experience the magic. A wonderful supporter of the Fountain, Susan executive produced several

plays with us, including Citizen: An American Lyric in 2015, and Cost of Living in 2018. She was particularly proud of the work that her family foundation was doing with children and theatre.

"The magic happens when the children take out their notebooks and read a scene that they have prepared and rehearsed!" Susan beamed with pride when she remembered the impact The Stockel Foundation had on young lives. In 2018 she spoke about how she first learned to give back from her parents.

"I learned about how important it was to share what I had with others who were in need by watching my father. He was a first-generation American — one of six children, and the only one to finish college. He had to work to help his family and went to night high school. Thankfully, in

those days, New York had tuition-free city college that opened up learning to an entire generation of students. He worked days in a clothing factory. My father always provided for his siblings when they needed help, and would pull out his checkbook and loan money to friends with never a due date on the loans. And, of course, he took care of his mother when he lost his father the month before his graduation from dental school. My husband and I also believed in continuing that tradition. We worked as a team when deciding what donations to make, and taught our values to our children. In my husband's honor, I established a family foundation, and I feel great joy working on the foundation's projects with my children and grandchildren, knowing that the work will continue, and the family will always be there for each other and for others."

Susan Stockel was truly one of The Fountain Theatre's angels. We are proud to honor her memory with our production of *Fly Me To The Sun*, and are grateful to *The Audre Slater Foundation for its extraordinary support of this production*.

From Susan: "When I was a little girl I loved to perform. I loved telling stories! I am a passionate lover of the spoken word. The Fountain Theatre was introduced to me many years ago. An intimate space on a tight budget — the Fountain was an unexpected surprise. Excellent plays, always well-cast and directed, with a loyal diverse audience from all over the city, who brave the traffic to attend!
