A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

A debate about God's existence is compelling under any circumstances. But, when set in the last days of the world's most famous atheist (Freud) – desperate to protect his legacy against the new-found conversion of a worthy adversary (C.S. Lewis), and set against Neville Chamberlain's committing Britain to WWII – it cannot be denied. The play's ideas, jolting and humorous, are best when they hit a raw nerve in the personal lives of the combatants. Let the battle begin.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT MARK ST. GERMAIN

Mark has written the plays Freud's Last Session (Off Broadway Alliance Award), Camping with Henry and Tom (Outer Critics Circle Award and Lucille Lortel Award) Forgiving Typhoid Mary, (Time Magazine's "Year's Ten Best") Dancing Lessons, Becoming Dr. Ruth, Best Of Enemies, Ears On A Beatie, Scott And Hem and Out Of Gas On Lover's Leap. His most recent play, Goerge Washington's Teeth, is set to have a world premiere production at Florida Rep in 2018. He is currently commissioned by Orlando Shakespeare Theatre to adapt Gertrude and Claudius by John Updike, a spring 2019 production is planned. Relativity, was commissioned and produced by Florida Studio Theater, opened in October, 2016 at TheaterWorks in Hartford, Connecticut starring Richard Dreyfuss and broke box office records in a two-months run at Northlight Theatre (Chicago), starring Mike Nussbaum as Einstein. With Randy Courts, he has written the musicals The Gifts Of The Magi, Johnny Pye and the Foolkiller, winner of an AT&T "New Plays For The Nineties Award" (Lamb's Theater). Jack's Holiday was produced at Playwrights Horizons. Mark's musical, Stand By Your Man: The Tammy Wynette Story, was created for Nashville's Ryman Theater and has toured nationally. He co-wrote the libretto for Charles Strouse's American Tragedy, and with John Markus wrote the comedy with music, The Fabulous Lipitones. (Premiered Theaterworks, Atlanta) Mark co-wrote the screenplay for Carroll Ballard's Warner Brothers film, Duma. He most recently directed and co-produced the documentary, My Dog, An Unconditional Love Story that features Richard Gere, Lynn Redgrave and Glenn Close, among many others. Television credits include writer and creative consultant for The Cosby Show, Life Stories and Dick Wolf's Crime And Punishment. Mark wrote the award-winning children's book Three Cups, illustrated by April Willy. He is an alumnus of New Dramatists, where he was given the Joe A. Callaway Award, a member of the Dramatists Guild, The Writers Guild of America East and an associate artist at the Barrington Stage Company. He was awarded the "New Voices In American Theatre" award at the William Inge Theatre Festival.

Subsequent repertory theater work took him around the British Isles, Birmingham Rep, Bristol Old Vic, Cambridge Arts, Liverpool Playhouse, Everyman Cheltenham, Glasgow Citizens, Theatre Clwyd Wales and others. Plays ranged from Shakespeare to farces. In Ireland, *The Shaughraun* at The Abbey Theatre ,Dublin, and *The Constant Couple* in Waterford; In London a spell at the National Theatre, in the West End with Coward's *The Vortex*, at Lyric Hammersmith playing Titus in Racine's *Berenice* and plays at The Greenwich Theatre. Television work includes *Good and Bad at Games*, *The Day After the Fair, Hedgehog Wedding*, *The Halcyon* and years ago, a pilot for NBC, Lovers

Partners and Spies. Martyn is married to Cindy Lou, a PhD in clinical psychology!

ROBERT MANDEL

Director

Robert Mandel recently took a nine-year hiatus from directing to serve as Dean at the American Film Institute Conservatory. He is an award-winning film and television director with credits including F/X, School Ties, Big Shots and The Substitute. He's directed numerous television movies and episodics, including X-Files (Pilot), Lost, Prison Break, and Dominion. Robert won an Emmy Award for his first TV movie, Andrea's Story. He has served as a Directing Mentor at the Sundance Institute and won first prize for his short film, Nights At O'Rears at Filmex in LA, USA Film Festival, Dallas, and a screening at the NY Film Festival at Lincoln Center. He is the recipient of the special educator award given by The Caucus for Producers, Writers & Directors. Mandel directed theatre in NY at the Manhattan Theatre Club, the Roundabout Theatre Company and The Public, where Joseph Papp was his mentor. He directed regionally in Providence, Washington DC, and Syracuse.

PETE HICKOK

Scenic Designer

Pete is a scenic designer, production designer, and artist based out of Los Angeles. His most recent scenic design projects include Farragut North at the Odyssey Theater, Die, Mommie Die! at Celebration Theater, and Crimes of the Heart at the International City Theater in Long Beach. He was also recently production designer for Medicare Mermaids, and among his other ventures is curating and exhibiting in the contemporary art world. He was nominated for a 2016 Ovation Award for his design of Rio Hondo at the Theater of Note. He holds an MFA and PB from the San Francisco Art Institute and a BFA from Lewis and Clark College. Recipient of the 2015 Stage Raw award and multiple Ovation nominations for sound design.

Costume Designer

Kim DeShazo teaches costuming for the stage and dramatic literature at El Camino College, where she designs all of the dance productions and theatre as well. She also teaches costume crafts and designs at College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita. She has designed at Long Beach City College, Cal State Dominguez Hills and Mt.San Antonio College. This is her second production for the Odyssey, following Awake and Sing. Kim is the resident costume designer for International City Theatre in Long Beach and has worked with them for fourteen years. She has worked with the Hollywood Bowl on their staged summer musicals for the past thirteen years. An Ovation Award nominee, she has had her work showcased at the Falcon Theatre, Shakespeare Festival/LA, Theatricum Botanicum, LA Opera, Andak, Opera a la Carte, Pasadena Dance Theatre and Long Beach Opera. Industry work in the LA area includes projects for Nike, Adidas, Skechers, Cherokee and Diesel clothing, as well as commercials for AFLAC, Best Buy, Target, Disney, Jack in the Box, Luxor Hotel, Hewlett Packard, Little Caesar's, DIRECTV, McDonald's and Mattel. Television and film credits range from The Real, The Price is Right, Ozzy Osbourne's Variety Show and a pilot for Bobby Flay, to work for the Academy Awards show, Nickelodeon and the Disney Channel.


GREG VELASCO KUCUKARSLAN






