to the Latino Theater Company's 2024 Spring Season, which explores history to illuminate the collective humanity of our cross-cultural experiences in a place as wonderfully diverse as Los Angeles today.

We open our season with the world premiere of Oliver Mayer's *Ghost Waltz*, commissioned and developed through the Latino Theater Company's playwrights' group The Circle of Imaginistas. Mayer's drama is a picaresque of the brief life of the genius Juventino Rosas, an Indigenous composer from Mexico whose masterpiece *Sobre Las Olas* has been falsely attributed to Austrian Johann Strauss. The play is a genuine theatrical event, blending music, magic and dance to show an untold history of Rosas' remarkable life in the Americas, colonialism's impact on the continent, and the power of music to unite.

The second play of our season is our production of José Cruz González's *American Mariachi,* which tells the story of young Mexican American women in the 1970s using the extraordinary power of music to overcome adversity, battle sexism, and grow as a group to discover themselves in a world steeped in patriarchy. The play mixes drama and comedy to pay tribute to tradition yet question cultural norms to build a more hopeful and fair future.

Latino Theater Company closes our season with a co-production with Playwrights Arena of the world premiere of Boni B. Alvarez's *Mix-Mix: The Filipino Adventures of a German Jewish Boy,* which tells the incredible true story of 13-year-old Rudy Preissman, whose family fled Nazi Germany to find sanctuary in the Philippines, only to have their lives threatened again by a Japanese invasion. Alvarez finds humanity and hope within the nightmare of war by highlighting the common bonds between peoples, the joy of sharing traditions, and the miracle of life itself.

We hope you enjoy our season and appreciate the rich cultural diversity we are blessed to have all around us in Los Angeles.

QUETZAL GUERRERO (Juventino Rosas) Multi-instrumentalist, singer, composer and actor Quetzal Guerrero, also known as QVLN (Q-Violin), is at the forefront of music genre evolution & exploration. Since very early childhood, Quetzal has lived, studied & performed all over the world. His musical journey has spanned from the Institute of Suzuki in Matsumoto, Japan, to the Capoeira rodas of Recife, Brazil; from the Nada Yoga School in Rishikesh, India, to the remote communities of aboriginal Australia & most recently the Gnawa music families of Essaouira in Morocco. He has recorded multiple albums & EPs as well as singles along with collaborations with globally renowned artists such as Osunlade. Oveous. Nickodemus, AtJazz and many more. His career has yet to reach its peak & continues to expand into the world of theatre & film. Quetzal has also had the amazing opportunity to be a musical ambassador for the American Music Abroad program throughout Latin America & serves as a prime example for how music can unite cultures & communities globally.

RIC'KEY PAGEOT (Scott Joplin) Ric'key is an internationally renowned award-winning musician, producer, arranger, musical director, composer, and proud Steinway Artist. He can now add actor to his illustrious career, as his role as Scott Joplin, the godfather of ragtime music, is his first ever professional acting role. Ric'key has performed piano and accordion with Madonna on four world tours since 2008 and also taught and coached her teenage daughter Mercy James piano for her breathtaking performances on her mom's 2023-24 Celebration Tour. Ric'kev has also toured with Cher, Cirque Du Soleil and is currently touring with pop star Christina Aguilera. One of his most memorable performances was with The Re-Collective orchestra live on CNN for the 2022 Juneteenth Celebration, making it the first all-black symphony orchestra to perform at the Hollywood Bowl. Ric'key has also written and recorded with Jill Scott and

legendary RnB band, Earth Wind and Fire. His own neo-ragtime original music has appeared on Netflix's *Selling Sunset* and ESPN's Women's NCAA Final Four broadcast. Ric'key has also performed on TV shows *Criminal Minds, The Housewives* of Beverly Hills and most recently, WWE's *Wrestlemania* in 2023. As if that wasn't enough, he still finds time to record and perform classical music written by historical composers of African descent.

NATHALIE PEÑA-COMAS (*Nightingale*) Dominican soprano Nathalie Peña-Comas is thrilled to make her debut in Los Angeles at the Latino Theater Company. EDUARDO ROBLEDO (Don Jesus) Eduardo began his musical/theater career with El Teatro Campesino. Over the decades he has acted and played music for many of its productions. He was also a longtime member of the San Francisco Mime Troupe, where he garnered 3 Bay Area Critics Awards for best musical score and had the honor of picking up the troupe's Tony Award for Excellence in Regional Theater. As an actor, Mr. Robledo has performed in various regional theater companies, including San Franciscos's Eureka theater and San Jose Repertory Theatre. More recently, he wrote the music and lyrics to a new Pastorela by Joan Holden and cowrote the music to Octavio Solis's Quixote Nuevo, Mr. Robledo is excited to have the opportunity to perform here at the Los Angeles Theatre Center of the Latino Theater Company.

CÁSTULO GUERRA (Professor Zeiss) Cástulo is delighted to return to the LATC, this time with a production about the Love of Music! In these twenty-some years, he appeared in Liz Estrada, La Olla, and La Virgen de Guadalupe Dios Inantzin, the annual pageant produced at the Cathedral of Los Angeles, all written by Evelina Fernández. He was in *Destiny of Desire* by Karen Zacarías at the Arena Stage, South Coast Rep, and at the Goodman Theater, all directed by José Luis Valenzuela. On film he has been in Terminator 2, The Usual Suspects, The Alamo, The Purge II, Bless Me Ultima, among others, and in Beverly Hills Chihuahua II with the memorable Lupe Ontiveros. On TV he was in Falcon Crest, ER, Star Trek: The Next Generation, Prison Break and many more. After narrating the audiobook Soñemos Juntos by Pope Francis (Simon and Schuster), he had the honor and privilege to narrate The Complete Collected Fictions by Jorge Luis Borges for Penguin Random House Audio. ARIEL BROWN (Bethena) A versatile performer, originally from Maryland (DMV), with a passion for storytelling. Ariel seamlessly transitions between the realms of theatre, film, TV, music, and dance. With a captivating presence honed through years of experience, she has graced screens through numerous national commercials and appearances on television shows like *Minx* now on STARZ. Her talent also shines through in independent films that have been featured in acclaimed festivals such as SXSW (24'). Beyond her work on screen, Ariel is also a singer/musician (violinist) under the stage name, Ariel Elizabeth. Her 5 song EP titled Parable of Ariel showcases her multifaceted artistry, blending soulful singing, poignant poetry, and exquisite violin melodies. With a distinct voice and a gift for musical expression, she hopes to draw each listener in with her refreshing authenticity. When it comes to dance. Ariel infuses her performances with a deep spiritual nature and African influences. She brings a dynamic energy and expressive flair to her artistry. Through dance, Ariel adds another dimension to her repertoire, showcasing her versatility and passion for the creative arts.

MONTE ESCALANTE (Marie Laveau) Monte Escalante is an Afro-Latin (Cuban/Jamaican) who hails from Cleveland Heights, Ohio, with a career spanning both stage and screen (AEA/SAG/AFTRA). Her recent Television credits include co-starring roles in Blackish and This is Us. Monte is honored to be an artistic ingredient in this rich story with such a diversely rich ensemble. She feels right at home having worked in two productions with the Robey Theatre Company at the LATC, The Talented 10th" and A Heated Discussion Revisited. She is a proud product of Howard University's (THE REAL HU) Fine Arts B.F.A. Program. Gloria a dios!!

JUAN PEREZ (*Bass Player*) Juan is one of L.A.'s most respected veteran musicians. Born and raised in Boyle Heights, Juan is a product of a public school education, when arts-in-schools programming was readily available. He studied violin with the "estudiantina" orchestra at Sheridan Street Elementary, added on bass at Hollenbeck Middle School and played in the band at Roosevelt High. His first club gig was at the legendary Troubadour in West Hollywood when he was only 14 years old. He played rent parties, backyard parties, wedding parties, birthdays, funerals - everywhere he could in the community, often playing with and learning from his elders and taking session work. Around this time, the "Eastside Renaissance" was in full swing, and Juan participated fully in this scene. In 2003, Juan joined the band Quetzal, already an established act and an inheritor of the traditions of Chicano music, from Ritchie Valens to Los Lobos. During this time, Juan undertook several trips to Veracruz, home of the "son jarocho" tradition which has inspired generations of L.A. musicians. He joined the foundational group Son de Madera and toured all over the U.S., Canada and Europe. Throughout, Juan never abandoned rock 'n' roll, with all its varied roots, fed by influences like Cream, Led Zeppelin, B.B. King, Santana, Curtis Mayfield, the Doors, Sam & Dave. In his playing, jazz meets Latin meets blues meets traditional, but the rock edge is always there. He stands at the meeting ground between the sounds of the street and academic training. He has recorded several albums with Quetzal, winning a Grammy for Best Latin Rock in 2012. He remains active in the studio, producing, writing and playing with some of L.A.'s most innovative artists.

OLIVER MAYER (*Playwright*) Oliver Mayer is a playwright, poet, essayist, and tenured professor at USC's School of Dramatic Arts. He is also a proud member of The Latino Theater Company's Circle of Imaginistas. Born and bred in LA, at age 1 he saw the original production of *Zoot Suit* and it changed his life. He has spent the bulk of his artistic life writing, mentoring, and being mentored by his fellow committed theatre artists, with hopefully no end in sight. Besides *Blade To The Heat*, Oliver has well over 30 original plays -- two of which were produced at the LATC -- *Joe Louis Blues* in 1992, and *Members Only* in 2018. With composer Jenni Brandon, he wrote the libretto to the opera *3 Paderewskis*, which received its world premiere at The Kennedy Center. In his work, he links arms with Lorca, Saroyan, Brecht and Valdez, and surfs the sounds and spirit of Marvin Gaye, JS Bach, Silvio Rodriguez, Jackie Wilson, and -- now --Juventino Rosas and Scott Joplin. *Ghost Waltz* is dedicated to all those recovering our stories from beneath the whitewash. And, as always, is para mi mas bella flor.

ALBERTO BARBOZA (Director)

Alberto Barboza is a theater and film director, screenwriter, and Emmy-nominated producer. He was born, raised, and public-schooled in Los Angeles from K through UCLA Masters of Fine Arts. Alberto is honored to collaborate with the stellar Ghost Waltz team and looks forward to working with these kindred spirits far into the future. He has worked with the Latino Theater Company for over 25 years and has directed several productions at The Los Angeles Theatre Center. Alberto was the Consulting Producer and Dialogue Coach on HULU's Emmy-nominated East Los High. His short films, Premeditation, and The Invitation, both aired on Showtime Channels: the former was written by LTC's Evelina Fernandez and was in automatic contention for The Academy's Best Short Film OscarTM. His feature film, Cry Now, features a loving performance by the late great Lupe Ontiveros. Alberto dedicates his work to the memory of his father, Jesus, and his brother, Edgar, who also worked and performed on the LATC stages. Siempre Presente.

ALBERTO LÓPEZ (Music Director) Alberto López received his first music lessons as a child in a neighborhood music school in Medellín, Colombia. Upon his family's move to the United States, he furthered his studies in piano and percussion at the New England

Conservatory in Boston, MA and The Juilliard School in New York City, respectively. In addition, Alberto studied counterpoint, harmony and orchestral conducting privately under the great Jacques-Louis Monod. While in New York, he came under the tutelage of Afro-Cuban drumming master and legend Felipe García Villamil, with whom he learned not only the drumming and music, but also the religious and ceremonial aspects of various Afro-Cuban cultural and spiritual traditions. Furthermore, he has traveled to Brazil, Colombia, Puerto Rico, Cuba and Nigeria to develop his knowledge of Afro-American music and culture. Residing in Los Angeles since 1999, Mr. López has performed, recorded, composed and/or produced music with artists such as Quetzal, Mstislav Rostropovich, Rubén Blades, Celia Cruz, Lee Ritenour, Stanley Clarke, LCD Soundsystem, The Brand New Heavies, The Dalai Lama, Juanes and Nobel Laureate Wole Soyinka, among others, and has been nominated for and/or been awarded Juno, Grammy, Oscar and Emmy awards for his work. Alberto is a co-founder and partner of Artivist Entertainment, an independent entertainment company founded in conjunction with Aloe Blacc. Maya Jupiter. Quetzal Flores and Veronica Gonzalez dedicated to representing artists whose art and music inspire positive social change, In January 2024, he opened Belú Music Press, a boutique vinyl record pressing plant in the Los Angeles area.

GIOVANNI ORTEGA (Assistant Director & Choreographer) Giovanni Ortega is so honoured to work with the Latino Theater Company. The Latino Theater Company celebrates 39 years of commitment to creating exciting, thought-provoking theater for the LA community. Founded at the LATC in 1985 with Artistic Director José Luis Valenzuela, the company has significantly contributed to the advancement of U.S. Latino Theater. In 2006 the City of Los Angeles awarded LTC with a 20-year lease to operate the Los Angeles Theatre Center, which was extended in 2021 for another 25 years to 2056.
