The Haitians (Creoles), having recently won their freedom from British colonizers want to have their own nation and belong to themselves. Haiti holds an important place in world history as the first free black nation and the first county in the Western Hemisphere to abolish slavery completely. This is told through a personal story that brings this important struggle for us to witness.

Haiti, the play, was written in 1938 as part of the WPA to get people back to work.
