

Most recently the company produced Crabs in a Bucket by Bernardo Cubria, The Thin Place by Lucas Hnath, Jessica Goldberg's BABE which won the LADDC award for best writing, Chiara Atik's Poor Clare, which won 8 LADCC Awards, Erik Patterson's Handjob and Sarah DeLappe's The Wolves, which was named one of the "Best Of" by both the LA Times and KCRW.
