#### A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Last fall JOHN and I mounted a workshop of "it's alive, IT'S ALIVE" at the ODYSSEY to explore the ramifications of doing an eclectic, nutty, theatrical event dealing with the whole COVID phenomenon. What kind of crazy idea was THAT? Would audiences even come? Would they be amused, on some level maybe even RELIEVED to be able to laugh at the rigors of life during these last few years?

Well, the results were very encouraging. Audiences did indeed FLOCK TO US and were genuinely responsive with a sense of a huge RELIEF OF TENSION.

JOHN and I have worked together on somewhat provocative theater pieces for more than thirty-five years now. In our early days our "mixed media" shows- using the primitive analog technology which was available- were arduous to construct but often contained some genuine magic in the telling. A piece called "BLESS-ED ARE ALL THE LITTLE FISHES", which I directed, was the cause of JOHN being denied an NEA grant for offensive content and triggered a lawsuit in which he and three other performance artists became nationally known as the NEA FOUR for fighting censorship.

Happily, we are not fighting censorship now. The ODYSSEY has encouraged us to come out swinging if we want to. And JOHN's talents as a "balls out" comedic, yet uniquely compelling performer/writer have been given free rein here to tell the story he wants to tell. And I am his devoted facilitator.

The fact that we continue to present a COVID comedy after so many months of the pandemic dragging on is not accidental. We feel like SPIRITS NEED TO BE RAISED, and taboos confronted! JOHN and I have always felt like that when we make theater.

In this case, we are using a bare bones open stage- the very opposite of the elaborate multi-media tech that we have often featured. This "FULL PRODUCTION" very intentionally resembles the VIBE of our workshop of last fall in that we are in a continual process of searching, channeling, exploring to get to the heart of our "take" on this toxic, highly precarious moment.

### **DAVID SCHWEIZER**

Director

David recently returned to the LA theater community to direct *In Circles* at the Odyssey Theatre. He has directed many memorable and rewarding shows in Los Angeles during the 1980's and 90's including The Waiting Room (Mark Taper Forum) *He Hunts, Sugar Plum Fairy* (Geffen Playhouse), Marlane Meyer's *Kingfish* and his own-devised *Joni Mitchell Project* at LATC, *Peer Gynt, Salome* and *Broadway* at the Actor's Gang, and *Plato's Symposium* with his own Modern Artists Company. David also directed and developed original theater and performance work by such crucial local artists as John Fleck, Sandra Tsing Loh, Ann Magnuson, Michael Sargent and Justin Tanner. More recently, back in NYC, he directed the OBIE award-winning *And God Created Great Whales* by Rinde Eckert, *Wintertime* by Charles Mee, Jr. and *The Fat Lady Sings* by Jean-Claude van Italie. His many new opera world premieres include *The Mines of Sulphur* at New York City Opera, *Elizabeth Cree* at Philadelphia Opera and *Emperor Of Atlantis* (New York Times ten-best list) at Boston Lyric Opera. He maintains a creative presence in the southland by directing often at Long Beach Opera, including recently *As One, Hydrogen Jukebox* and Leonard Bernstein's *Candide*.



JOHN FLECK
Writer, Performer

John is a performance artist and actor whose work has spanned performance spaces, museums, theater, television, and film. In 1990 Fleck and three other performance artists were branded the NEA-4 when their work was labelled 'obscene' by conservative lawmakers who put pressure on the National Endowment for the Arts to rescind their funding. They took their case to the Supreme Court and won. Performance art venues presenting Fleck's work include the ICA London, ICA Boston, Andy Warhol Museum,

New Museum, Public Theater, Guggenheim Museum, PS-122, Second Stage, La Mama, Dixon Place, Joe's Pub, Broad Stage, REDCAT, Getty Museum, Cal Plaza, MOCA. He has participated in theater productions at Getty Villa, La Jolla Playhouse, Geffen Theater, UCLA's Reprise, Kirk Douglas Theatre, South Coast Repertory and the Old Globe. A sampling of TV/Film roles include guest star/recurring/series regular roles in Orville, Criminal Minds, True Blood, Weeds, Carnivale, Tales of the City, Murder One, Seinfeld, Falling Down, Velvet Buzzsaw, etc etc
