DAN LAURIA Writer/Man

Dan is best known as the Dad on the hit television series *The Wonder Years*, has starred, recurred and guest-starred in over 70 television episodic programs, as well as in more than 20 Movie of the Week productions and a score of feature films. He has performed, written or directed over 50 professional stage productions. On Broadway, he starred as legendary coach Vince Lombardi opposite Judith Light in *Lombardi*, as well as in the Tony nominated *A Christmas Story: The Musical*, for two years running. He co-created the Durango Play Festival with Wendie Malick, with whom he has also performed the play *The Guys*, a tribute to the brave firefighters who died on 9/11, as a fundraiser for veterans and firefighting organizations. The two currently perform *Love Letters* around the country as a fundraiser for environmental organizations and to support the development of new plays at regional theaters.



PATTY McCORMACK

Woman

Audiences will recognize Patty from her more than seven decades of stage, screen and television appearances. From her Oscar and Golden Globe nominated performance in *The Bad Seed*, to work in the Oscar and Golden Globe-nominated *Frost/Nixon* and *The Master*, she also starred in her own television series, *Peck's Bad Girl*, and created memorable characters on television favorites from *Dallas* to *The Sopranos*. Her extensive theatrical work began with a Broadway debut at the age of six in *Touchstone*, before creating the iconic character of Rhoda Penmark in the Broadway production of *The Bad Seed* at eight years old. McCormack later transferred the role of Rhoda from stage to Mervyn LeRoy's classic and iconic film. Most recently, Patty starred in *House Of Deadly Secrets* for Netflix. She also made special appearances in Rob Lowe's adaptation of *The Bad Seed* for Lifetime, as well its sequel, *The Bad Seed Returns*.

ERIC KREBS

Director

Eric, whose theatrical career spans more than 50 years, has worked as a producer, theater-founder, operator, college professor, and occasionally as a performer. In 1974, he founded the George Street Playhouse regional theater in New Brunswick, New Jersey. He built and operated Off-Broadway's John Houseman Theater Center and Douglas Fairbanks Theater. Most recently, he renovated and became the operator of a 160-seat Off-Broadway Theater, reopening it as Theater 555. Off-Broadway, he has produced more than 50 plays and musicals. On Broadway, he

produced *Bill Maher: Victory Begins At Home* (Tony nomination for Best Special Theatrical Event), *It Ain't Nothin' But The Blues* (nominated for four Tony Awards including Best Musical) and *Electra* (nominated for three Tony Awards). In 2007, he performed his own adaptation of *King Lear*, entitled *Considering Lear*. In 2016 he performed *My Father's Voice*, a presentation of his father's letters from the Ellis Island Prison and the war in the Pacific.

LORD GRAHAM RUSSELL

Composer/Vocalist

Lord Graham Russell is a British musician and songwriter, best known as one half of the soft rock duo Air Supply. Born on June 11, 1950, in Arnold, Nottinghamshire, he developed a lifelong passion for music and writing from a young age, influenced by the loss of his mother and the music of The Beatles. He formed Air Supply with Russell Hitchcock in Australia in 1975, and the duo has since become known for romantic ballads like "Lost in Love" and "All Out of Love," selling millions of records worldwide and touring extensively. He also released a solo album and published a book of poetry, maintaining a passion for nature and wildlife, and he holds the title of Lord through a family lineage.

PETE HICKOK

Scenic Designer

Pete is a production designer, art director, scenic designer, and artist based in Los Angeles. His designs have appeared across Southern California theaters such as the Geffen Playhouse, the Kirk Douglas Theatre, the Odyssey Theatre Ensemble and the International City Theatre. He holds an MFA and PB from the San Francisco Art Institute and a BFA from Lewis & Clark College.

MICHAEL BLENDERMAN

Lighting Designer

Michael began theater and lighting work in high school and has gone on to design and operate lighting for various styles of production, including work in dance, experimental theater, site specific productions and experiential installations. He has had the pleasure of working with international artists and directors through the MFA in Performance program at Naropa University and the Boulder Fringe festival, and has toured nationally as a lighting director for dance production.

Producer/Acting Artistic Director


Beth is the Odyssey staff producer and has performed in over 30 Odyssey productions.

IN MEMORY OF RON SOSSI Odyssey Founder/Artistic Director from 1969 - 2025

In 1969, frustrated and bored by his work in the television industry, Ron founded the Odyssey Theatre in a former storefront church on the seedy end of Hollywood Boulevard. the Odyssey opened its inaugural productions of *A Man's A Man* by Bertolt Brecht, *The Serpent* by Jean Claude van Italie, *The Threepenny Opera* by Brecht and Kurt Weill, and *The Bacchae* by Euripides. In 1973, he moved the Odyssey to a larger venue in West Los Angeles on the corner of Bundy and Ohio where, starting out with one 99-seat performance space, he gradually expanded it into a three-theater complex. During the company's 16-year tenure in that space, Ron produced and directed two thirds of the Bertolt Brecht canon. When the building was sold in 1989, Ron moved the Odyssey to its current home on Sepulveda Boulevard, a city-owned warehouse formerly used to manufacture gas tanks. The new Odyssey opened its doors in 1990 with his production of *Faith Healer*.

Throughout the theater's 56-year history, Ron remained dedicated to presenting edgy, risk-taking live theater experiences, including an eclectic mix of new work and boldly re-envisioned classics. He was always particularly drawn to work by German and Eastern European playwrights, as well as to plays exploring metaphysical and spiritual subject matter — part of a lifelong devotion that included studying and practicing Siddha Yoga, Hinduism, Sufism, Tibetian Buddhism, The Gurdjieff Work and, most recently, Bhakti Yoga and Advaita Vedanta. In 2001, Ron created KOAN, a resident ensemble dedicated to the regular creation of unique, devised works. (In Zen Buddhism, a Koan is a paradoxical anecdote or riddle used to demonstrate the inadequacy of logical reasoning and to provoke enlightenment.) Ron's KOAN productions included *The Faust Projekt, Kafka Thing* and *Buddha's Big Nite!*, as well as *Sliding Into Hades*, which received the LA Weekly Award for "Best Production of the Year" and *Theater in the Dark*, an LA Weekly "Best Production" award nominee.

At the helm of the Odyssey for 56 continuous years, Ron was the recipient of numerous awards, including the LA Weekly Career Achievement Award. He was twice honored with the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle prestigious Margaret Harford Award for "demonstrating a continual willingness to experiment provocatively in the process of theater," as well as with the circle's Ron Link Award for "consistent quality of direction." According to a 1982 Los Angeles Times article by Lawrence Christon, "When the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle debated Ron's merit as this year's recipient of the Margaret Harford Award—they decided he deserved it—two adjectives that cropped up in discussion were 'exasperating' and 'incorrigible.'" Christon went on to note that Ron "wished they had put 'incorrigible' on the award."


