IN MEMORIAM

It is with a heavy heart and sadness that International City Theatre says goodbye to two long-term board members who served ICT for decades, giving generously of their time and resources to keep ICT going and growing, Ron Chatman and Julie Mendell. They are loved and will be missed.



Ron Chatman was a valued board member who supported the work of ICT, especially with young people and our work in the community. He was a very caring and kind gentleman you could call on for assistance, and he would always try to help. He faced his health challenges with dignity and strength, and despite those challenges, he showed up. Ron set an example for all of us with his extraordinary humanity.

Ron dedicated over 34 years of his life in postsecondary education, beginning in 1970 as an administrator at Compton Community College through retirement as Deputy Superintendent, Executive Vice President in 2004. He held a Master's of Science Degree in Community College Student Personnel Services and a Bachelor of Science Degree in English. Additionally, he received an Honorary Doctorate in Education, an Honorary Law Degree and a Fellow at Oxford University, England.

From retirement, he became Probono Head Master of St. Timothy's Episcopal Day School with simultaneous service as Executive Director of St. Timothy's Tower and Manor, Inc. Other organizations he supported included Member of the Board of Trustees of the Los Angeles School of Law, member of the L.A. County Commission of Beaches and Harbors, member of 100 Black Men of Los Angeles, the NAACP, and the National Urban League.



Julie Mendell also served ICT's Board for decades and served on the Executive Committee as Secretary for many of those years. She was a school principal and, in that capacity, provided ICT the opportunity to develop its Performing Arts Classroom Teaching third grade program which the school district asked us to create about 25 years ago. Julie also took on the Silent Auction for our annual Encore fundraiser, spending hours collecting items and organizing the display, a herculean task which she did

for many years. She blessed ICT and our community, giving generously of her time and talents to many.

Julie Mendell was born and raised in Long Beach. She earned her B.A. at CSULB and a Master's degree at University of La Verne. Julie worked as a teacher and principal and retired from Long Beach Unified School District. Since retirement, she was active in working to support nonprofit organizations that serve the community.

Other organizations in which she was involved include Meals on Wheels of Long Beach, Assistance League of Long Beach, Children's Dental Health Clinic, 32/32 Club, CalRTA and Dramatic Results. Julie was also honored as a Press Telegram Amazing Woman in 2015.

Both Ron and Julie received ICT's James Ackerman Crystal Arts and Humanitarian Awards.

We are grateful for their years of service and support.

Our hearts and prayers are with their families.

She taught college for more than 25 years and received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Long Beach City College. She served as a Dramaturgical Responder for the graduate playwriting students at USC and served as Vice Chair for the LA Producers League for Large Theatres. In 2016 she was the keynote speaker at the Disneyland Hotel for INTIX. That same year she accepted the LA Drama Critics Circle Award for Outstanding Season and was recognized as a 2016 Community Hero by the African American History & Culture Foundation. In 2018 caryn was named Distinguished Alumna from the College of the Arts at California State University, Long Beach. Prior to the pandemic, she returned to teaching Nonprofit Arts Management at CSU, Fullerton. She was honored to be included on the Long Beach City College Hall of Fame and to receive a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Long Beach NAACP. Recently she was honored to be named an LA 2023 Inspirational Woman by the LA Times and had the privilege to serve as Mace Marshall for UC Irvine's graduates from the School of Arts, School of Education, and School of Physical Sciences. She was honored to receive the 2024 Eternity Award by the Los Angeles Women's Theatre Festival for lifetime achievement in making a lasting contribution to the world of theatre and privileged to be recognized by Soroptimists International as one of the Women Who Have Made an Impact on the Long Beach Community.

Lucy Pollak (Publicist) has been providing publicity services to the Los Angeles performing arts community for the past 31 years – and her very first client was International City Theatre, with which she has proudly continued to work to this day! Prior to that, she was production manager/staff producer at the Odyssey Theatre, where she co-produced over 100 productions with artistic director Ron Sossi. She is the recipient of a Los Angeles Drama Critic's Circle Award (Master Class), an L.A. Weekly Award (Mary Barnes), four Drama-Logue Awards (Mary Barnes, Idioglossia, Accidental Death of An Anarchist, It's A Girl!), and a Women in Theatre Recognition Award. She has served on the boards of directors of the Los Angeles Theatre Alliance (L.A. Stage Alliance), Women in Theatre.

Michael Donovan Casting (Casting Directors) has cast over 135 shows here at ICT. Michael Donovan recently received his 10th Artios award, presented by the Casting Society of America for Outstanding Achievement in casting. Richie Ferris just received his 4th Artios award. 


