

SETTING

The 1960's in a small Kansas town in the backyard shared by Flo and Helen. The play takes place early on Labor Day morning and ends just after sunrise the next day.

Running time is 2 hours with one fifteen-minute intermission.

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

After a decade of directing highly visceral adaptations of ancient works, I was beckoned to pursue and explore a different kind of mythology - America. William Inge's romantic masterwork Picnic is a potent mix of deeply human juxtapositions—love and family, morality and longing, fortune and desperation, idealism and reality, frailty and resilience, fear and courage, prejudice and acceptance, small towns and big cities—Essentially, it's about America. To me, it seemed that the American story was deeply embedded in the Black American experience. A country that quickly became an economic superpower, built largely on the skills and forced labor of its generationally deep residents. The many ways America distinguishes itself from the rest of the world musically and culturally, from Jazz to Rock and Roll to Blues and Soul Music are from Black Americans' perspective and contributions. I wasn't sure if it would work at first, I was loath to change a word of text, but it turned out nothing needed to be adjusted. The play, in the hands of a black cast, rang like a bell. Rather than narrowing the scope of the play, it only expanded the scope of the story of America, inviting us all to celebrate how unique and similar our human experiences are. This sweet and sorrowful story of innocence explores the enormous question of identity; identity of self and the Country we live in. Are you going to live your life for others, or for yourself? Where does love fit in? Love of self, Love of community, Love of another? Ultimately, whether a new adaptation or new point of view, I'm ever hoping the vision employed ends up accentuating and elaborating what the play actually is, and its themes, not what it isn't. From sleeping in parks to drug-addicted parents, writer, actor, model and motivational speaker, Monti Washington has had quite a journey to living out his American Dream. For nearly ten years, Monti has had the pleasure of starring in several independent films, as well as being featured in numerous commercials, and being awarded the opportunity to speak at more than

130 venues (including colleges and conferences) across the nation. Monti has appeared on a number of television networks in major recurring roles and is currently a series regular in Tyler Perrys *Bruh* on BET.

WILLIAM INGE

Playwright

William Inge (1913 - 1973) was born in Independence, KS as the second son of a travel-ling salesman and the youngest of five children. Inge's passion for the performing arts start-ed at a young age. Although his family wasn't wealthy, his Boy Scout troop was often invited to sit in the balcony of the Civic Center to attend shows by many of the top artists stopping over between gigs in Kansas City and Tulsa. In 1935, Inge graduated from the University of Kan-sas at Lawrence with a B.A. in Speech and Drama. In interviews, Inge often said that at this point in his life he wanted to go straight to work on Broadway, but felt that he didn't have enough money. He accepted a scholarship to the George Peabody College for Teachers in Nashville to work on his master's degree, but later became disillusioned and dropped out. "I sort of based my life on the theatre," said Inge. "Having given up the theatre I had given up the basis that I'd set my life upon. I was terribly confused. I went home to Kansas and began to flounder." Back in Kansas, Inge drifted from job to job: state highway laborer to news an-nouncer to high school English teacher. He eventually returned to Peabody to complete his master's degree and taught for a few years at Stephens College in Columbia, MO. It was in 1943 when Inge took a position as the drama and music critic for the St. Louis Times that his life changed dramatically. He travelled with a then-struggling playwright, Tennessee Williams, to review the first production of The Glass Menagerie in Chicago. "I was terrifically moved by the play,' said Inge. "I thought it was the finest (play) I had seen in many years. I went back to St. Louis and felt, 'Well, I've got to write a play." Within three months he had completed Farther Off From Heaven. This was followed by a series of critical and popular Broadway sucesses: Come Back, Little Sheba (1 950), Picnic (1 953), Bus Stop (1955),

and *The Dark at the Top of the Stairs* (1957). In 1958, Inge's mother passed away. Devasted by this loss and having struggled with depres-sion and alcoholism his entire life, Inge never fully recovered personally or professionally. His last success was his first screenplay, *Splendor in the Grass* (1960). Inge moved to the West Coast and started teaching at the University of California at Irvine, but became increasingly depressed and left in 1970. On June 10, 1973, Inge committed suicide at his home in Hollywood, where he lived with his sister, Helene. Buried in his hometown of Independence, his headstone reads simply, "Playwright."

JOHN FARMANESH-BOCCA

Director, Co-Chreographer, Co-Sound Designer

An Ovation and Drama Critics Circle award-nominated artist, some of John's award-winning and award nominated physical theatre adaptations include *Pericles Redux* (European and U.S. Premieres), *Wish I Had A Sylvia Plath* (Edinburgh Fringe First Award Winner). In LA: *Titus Redux* (Kirk Douglas Theatre), *As/Is* (New American Theatre), *Hercules Furens* (Getty Villa), *Tempest Redux* (Odyssey Theatre). *Ajax in Iraq* (LA premiere) and *Lysistrata Unbound* (world premiere) John is the founding artistic director of both Not Man Apart – Physical Theatre Ensemble (since 2005) and Shakespeare Santa Monica (2003–2014). John now serves as emeritus director of the award-winning Not Man Apart Ensemble, which under his watch was named by Backstage Magazine in 2014 as one of the 13 most innovative physical theatre companies in the world. Awarded an American Theatre Wing scholarship, John trained at NYU's Tisch School of the Arts in Acting ('94) before serving as a Directing Fellow at the Juilliard School - Drama Division (2003-2005).

FREDERICA NASCIMENTO

Scenic Designer

Frederica is a designer and artist working in theatre, film and multidisciplinary design in the US and internationally. Being an architect informs her work with a focus on materiality, storytelling and conceptual thinking, creating spaces and environments that are alive and empowered by collaboration. MFA in Scenic and Production Design for Film at NYU/TSOA, scholar with Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, member of the Portuguese Architects Association, Usual Suspect at New York Theatre Workshop, Resident Artist at A Noise Within, USA 829/IATSE. Faculty at LA Pierce College, LA Southwest College, and CSUN. Nominated for NAACP, Ovation and LADCC Awards. Frederica received the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award 2020-2021 in Best Set Design for *An Octoroon* by Branden Jacobs-Jenkins at the Fountain Theatre. 
