PROGRAM NOTE

What a wonderful premise for a play! The notorious Stalin and his cultural minister summon two noted composers, Prokofiev and Shostakovich, to their lair one cold winter night. Vodka abounds in the Kremlin, as Stalin attempts to cajole the two into mending their ways. This encounter never happened in reality, but it very well could have, as 1948 marked the notorious Soviet conference of musicians on the same subject, a condemnation of the avant garde and a return to safer, more conventional musical forms.

The issue of art versus government control is certainly an obvious and important one here, but the playwright's intent on providing an alternate view of a known tyrant is fascinating. We don't see much material speculating on the other side of Stalin and that alone is intriguing, but to have this delivered both dramatically and comedically is the real treat. Pownall's play was once called "Who's Afraid of Virginia Wolff" for tyrants and artists. Instead of a game of 'get the guests' here we have "get the composers"!

We hope you'll enjoy this crazy, sometimes absurdist, beast as much as we did riding it!

JOHN KAYTON Andrei Zhdanov

John has worked in many Off-Broadway productions, including *Management* at Circle in the Square and *Rancho a Hollywood Dream* at the Henry Street Settlement, while studying with Bill Esper. John is a founding member of the American Theatre of Actors, under the direction of James Jenning, performing in *Trumpet's Sounding, My Father's House* and *King Lear*. Like Lear, John has three powerful daughters; however, unlike Lear, these daughters are also loving and kind. Jatu and Kimberlee have navigated life's whirlwinds for over 43 years in true happiness and love. In Los Angeles, John is working with the Hudson Workspace under the direction of Howie Deutch, and he is fortunate to have great mentors in Bill Alderson, Barry Primus, Jack Waltzer and Amir Korangy. *Stalin's Master Class* is John's first show at Odyssey Theatre Ensemble. He loves our talented cast and director Ron Sossi.



RANDY I OWFI I

Dmitri Shostakovich

Randy previously appeared in Odyssey productions of *Mary Barnes, A Map of the World,* and the 1987 production of *Master Class.* An accomplished musician, he was music director for the Odyssey production of *Mother Courage,* and composed scores for Odyssey productions of *Fantod, The Exception and the Rule,* and the book, music, and lyrics for his own musical, *Symmes' Hole.* Film and television credits include *Erin Brockovich, Contagion, Mrs. Parker and the Vicious Circle, Real Genius, ER, Still Standing* and *Star Trek: Voyager.* Among other things, he has taught music for the last thirteen years at a public elementary school in Silver Lake. He's delighted to work with Ron Sossi again at the Odyssey.



JAN MUNROE

Sergei Prokofiev

Jan has been involved in the creation of new performance work as choreographer, director, writer, performer and designer since early studies with Marcel Marceau and Etienne Decroux. A founding member of The Mystic Knights of the Oingo-Boingo (Los Angeles), and The Theatah of the Apres-Garde (Bay Area and Los Angeles), he is a recipient of two N.E.A. fellowships, a Rockefeller Playwright's fellowship, a California Arts Council "New Genre" fellowship, 11 L.A. Weekly and Drama-Loque awards and an Ovation award. His own work includes Alligator Tails (published in West Coast Plays), Little Monsters (for five performers and 27 TVs), Nothing Human Disgusts Me (LA Weekly Best Solo Show; 1992), Woodworks (for nine dancers and percussion ensemble) and in the Odyssey's Threshold of Invention series. As an actor he has originated roles in plays by Thomas Babe, The Modern Artists Company, Austin Pendleton's Booth, Bart DeLorenzo's Hard Times and Michael Sargent's Black Leather.



ILIA VOLOK Joseph Stalin

Ilia was born in Kiev, Ukraine, where he lived for the first half of his life. He's appeared in close to 180 films and television shows. Recent theater credits include Our Class at the Brooklyn Academy of Music, GAGA at Arlekin Players Theater, Yaacobi and Leidental at the Odyssey Theatre, The Orchard at the Baryshnikov Art Center opposite Mikhail Baryshnikov and Jessica Hecht, and The Revisionist by Oscar nominee Jesse Eisenberg at the Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts. Ilia's one-man show, Diary of a Madman, won the LA Weekly Theater Award for Best Solo Performance. Other TV credits include HBO's Minx, CBS' Magnum PI, FX's Oh Jerome No, CBS' MacGyver, Marvel/Netflix's The Punisher, Swedish Dicks, Counterpart, Stitchers, Criminal Minds, Baskets, Shameless, The Americans, NCIS, NCIS New Orleans, Hawaii 5.0, Two Broke Girls, and Clipped.

DAVID POWNALL

Playwright

David Pownall (1938 – 2022) was an internationally-renowned playwright for stage, TV and radio. His stage plays have been performed extensively, including runs on Broadway and at the National Theatre, Old Vic, Wyndham and Barbican in London, and the Royal Shakespeare Company. His best-known works include *Music to Murder By* (winner of an Edinburgh Festival Fringe First), *Livingstone and Sechele* (winner of the London Stage Directors' Award) and *Elgar's Rondo*, which was commissioned by the RSC. His best-known work is *Stalin's Master Class*, a portrayal of composers Shostakovich and Prokofiev in the grip of Stalin's cultural dictatorship. It has been revived numerous times in the UK and performed in over twenty countries, many of them ex-soviet territories, including Russia. He once declared that he intended to write "to the bitter end," and was working on a radio play until just before his death in 2022.

RON SOSSI

Director

Ron received the LA Weekly Career Achievement Award in 2013. He has also received the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Margaret Harford Award for "demonstrating a continual willingness to experiment provocatively in the process of theatre" and the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Ron Link Award for "consistent quality of direction." Recent OTE directing projects include Faith Healer, The Dance of Death, Beckett5, My Sister, Oedipus Machina, Theatre in the Dark (LA Weekly nomination Best Production of the Year), Way to Heaven (LA Weekly and LADCC nomination for Best Production of the Year), Adding Machine: A Musical, The Arsonists (LA Weekly nomination for Best Direction) Sliding Into Hades (Best Production of the Year, LA Weekly), Kafka Thing!, Far Away and The Threepenny Opera. Ron has led the Odyssey throughout its 54-year history.

MICHAEL REDFIELD

Pianist

Michael has spent his life in Los Angeles theater. He made his Odyssey debut in 2007 with Craig Lucas' *Small Tragedy*, and works regularly at Pacific Resident Theatre in Venice and Rogue Machine Theatre, where he is a founding member. He's received multiple Ovation, LA Weekly and LADCC nominations for roles in *Small Tragedy, When They Speak of Rita* and *Happy End*. He starred in *Small Engine Repair* at Rogue Machine, which swept the 2013 LA theater awards for production and ensemble, with Variety asserting, "Redfield walks off with the evening...there's no end of joy in his irrepressible love of life." As a pianist and composer, he's worked at 24th Street Theatre for over a decade, accompanying their flagship educational show, *Enter Stage Right*, which serves 10,000 LAUSD school children every year, and he won an Ovation award for his original live score for 24th Street's *Walking the Tightrope*.

PETE HICKOK

Scenic Designer

Pete is a production designer, art director, scenic designer and artist based in Los Angeles. His designs have appeared across Southern Californian theaters such as Geffen Playhouse, Kirk Douglas Theatre, Odyssey Theatre Ensemble and the International City Theatre. He holds an MFA and Post-Baccalaureate from the San Francisco Art Institute and a BFA from Lewis & Clark College.

JACKSON FUNKE

Lighting Designer

Jackson is an award-winning theatre and dance designer from Minneapolis and currently working in Los Angeles. Selected work includes Ate9 Dance Company (Off to a Good Start); Heidi Duckler Dance (Body of the People, 37th Annual Gala); Connecticut Repertory Theatre (Replay, 4.48 Psychosis); Odyssey Theatre Ensemble (Elephant Shavings, BEFOK); Playhouse on Park (Bandstand, Pippin, Broadway World Regional Award); Newfangled Theatre Company (PRIMAL, Liquid Light Show, Gary, Helen, and Peter); Northern Starz Children's Theatre (Still Life with Iris); The Matchbox Theatre (All of the Garden: Moulin Rouge); and Jackdonkey Productions Theatre Co. (Dock Work). Jackson is an MFA lighting design candidate at California Institute of the Arts. He has scored series and specials for National Geographic and The Discovery Channel, ZDF Germany, specials and promos for HBO, BBC, Animal Planet, MSNBC and The History Channel. Theater highlights include The Kennedy Center, The Smithsonian Institution, The Shakespeare Theatre, Signature Theatre, Roundhouse Theatre, Rogue Machine, A Noise Within, Antaeus Theater, Odyssey Theatre, Skylight Theatre, Fountain Theatre, Road Theatre and Pacific Resident Theater, and he served as assistant conductor for the national tour of *The Phantom of the Opera*.

Prop Designer

She has also done composing/orchestrating/arranging and session work for the major recording studios in Los Angeles, working with artists such as Korn, Richard Page, Eisley, Vinnie Colaiuta, Luis Conte, Miles Mosley, Joe Sumner, Ozomatli and Mystic Marley. In addition to performing and composing, Nisha has taught music for over 25 years. She is the co-founder of Happy Human Music Project, a Los Angeles based music education organization, aimed at providing music lessons for students of all ages and abilities.


