Hunter and before that Dido of Idaho by Abby Rosebrock which won three LADCC awards, and before that the world premiere of Bernardo Cubria's Crabs In A Bucket, LADCC winner, The Thin Place by Lucas Hnath and Jessica Goldberg's BABE which won the LADDC award for best writing,
