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James G. Thompson, letter to the Pittsburgh Courier proposing Double V (Jan. 31, 1942)

Like all true Americans, my greatest desire at this time, this crucial point of our history; is a desire for a complete victory over the forces of evil, which threaten our existence today. Behind that desire is also a desire to serve, this, my country, in the most advantageous way. Most of our leaders are suggesting that we sacrifice every other ambition to the paramount one, victory. With this I agree; but I also wonder if another victory could not be achieved at the same time. After all, the things that beset the world now are basically the same things which upset the equilibrium of nations internally, states, counties, cities, homes and even the individual. Being an American of dark complexion and some 26 years, these questions flash through my mind: "Should I sacrifice my life to live half American?" "Will things be better for the next generation in the peace to follow?" "Would it be demanding too much to demand full citizenship rights in exchange for the sacrificing of my life." "Is the kind of America I know worth defending?" "Will America be a true and pure democracy after this war?" "Will colored Americans suffer still the indignities that have been heaped upon them in the past?" These and other questions need answering; I want to know, and I believe every colored American, who is thinking, wants to know. This may be the wrong time to broach such subjects, but haven't all good things obtained by men been secured through sacrifice during just such times of strife? I suggest that while we keep defense and victory in the forefront that we don't lose sight of our fight for true democracy at home. The "V for Victory" sign is being displayed prominently in all so-called democratic countries which are fighting for victory over aggression, slavery and tyranny. If this V sign means that to those now engaged in this great conflict then let colored Americans adopt the double VV for a double victory—The first V for victory over our enemies from without, the second V for victory over our enemies within. For surely those who perpetrate these ugly prejudices here are seeing to destroy our democratic form of government just as surely as the Axis forces. This should not and would not lessen our efforts to bring this conflict to a successful conclusion; but should and would make us stronger to resist these evil forces which threaten us. America could become united as never before and become truly the home of democracy. In way of an answer to the foregoing questions in a preceding paragraph, I might say that there is no doubt that this country is worth defending; things will be different for the next generation; colored Americans will come into their own, and America will eventually become the true democracy it was designed to be. These things will become a reality in time; but not through any relaxation of the efforts to secure them. In conclusion let me say that though these questions often permeate my mind, I love American and am willing to die for the America I know will someday become a reality.

Carole Eglash-Kosoff (Playwright) is a novelist, playwright, and documentary filmmaker. She lives and writes in Valley Village, California. She graduated from UCLA and pursued a successful business career. When her husband died in 2006, she traveled and worked in the black townships of South Africa for two years. That work yielded her 1st book and stage play, *The Human Spirit*. Since then, she has been teaching, writing, and traveling to more than eighty countries. She also established the CEK Foundation to fund scholarships to deserving high school seniors. She has published ten novels, produced two documentary films, including the award-winning *The Life & Art of David Labkovski*. She has written and produced four stage plays, including the Ovation Award-winning musical, *When Jazz Had the Blues*. In 2018 caryn was named Distinguished Alumna from the College of the Arts at California State University, Long Beach. Prior to the pandemic, she returned to teaching Nonprofit Arts Management at CSU, Fullerton. Recently she was honored to be included on the Long Beach City College Hall of Fame and to receive a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Long Beach NAACP. Most recently she was honored to be named an LA 2023 Inspirational Woman by the LA Times and had the privilege to serve as Mace Marshall for UC Irvine's graduates from the School of Arts, School of Education, and School of Physical Sciences. She is honored to be the recipient of the 2024 Eternity Award by the Los Angeles Women's Theatre Festival for lifetime achievement in making a lasting contribution to the world of theatre.

Lucy Pollak (Publicist) has been providing publicity services to the Los Angeles performing arts community for the past 31 years – and her very first client was International City Theatre, with which she has proudly continued to work to this day! Prior to that, she was production manager/staff producer at the Odyssey Theatre, where she co-produced over 100 productions with artistic director Ron Sossi. 
