DIRECTOR'S NOTE

We chose to include **The Soldier Dreams** in our Winter 2020 season back in November of 2019. We felt it important to acknowledge and mark 40 years of dealing with the devastation of the AIDS epidemic, hoping the production might serve as a reminder and remembrance of all the gorgeous souls lost to (and still battling) that insidious disease. There were plans for talk-backs with leaders in the LGBTQIA+ community, with folx who'd been on the front lines of the battle in the 80s and 90s (this play was written and is set in 1997; I was in Chicago at the time, going to exactly the kind of dance clubs David and Judy both loved. and seeing for myself the toll AIDS was taking on my friends, especially those within our tight-knit theatre community.) We finalized casting on March 11th, 2020; two days later we'd press "pause" on the Rorschach Fest we had running at AVT, thinking we'd be on-hold for maybe a couple weeks, maybe a month. Early on the cast met regularly via Zoom as this other awful virus took hold around the world. When it was clear this wasn't going to be a production pause of just a few months, I told the cast we'd regroup in the Summer (of 2020)... then we spoke of regrouping in the late Fall... Okay, early 2021 — surely by then we'd have a hold on this thing. I don't need to tell anyone how that worked out.

Finally in July we regrouped on Zoom to check in, to see if there was still interest in telling this story. I will admit here that I wondered more than a few times if we'd missed our moment, if audiences would think it possibly in poor taste to move ahead with a play that explores a family as they are forced to say goodbye to a loved one due to an unfair virus. Two of our original cast members had relocated during the pandemic, but the rest of the ensemble remained intact and game to bring the play to life. We met for our first in-person read-thru in the courtyard of AVT one evening in late August, all vaxxed and still masked. After the read, we talked and came to the conclusion that not only did the play still work its gentle magic of celebrating life as it dealt with the confusion and awfulness of death, it might in fact be something of a balm for our times as it doesn't shy away from all that sucks about loss, but at the same time it reminds us that there is a kind of immortality made possible when we take time to connect and remember (and "dance and get remarkably drunk and fight...") It is so very human to fear death and the unknowns about whatever might come next. What I love about this play is it allows for the possibility (probability?) that the beat goes on, somewhere, somehow. This isn't a religious thing, but an energy thing. There is an energy to love and to loss and to wanting to find answers (to asking "Why?") it's all part of the beautiful dance of life and I'm so glad you allowed us to cut in to share this one with you.

"Why **NEVER SWIM ALONE**?" I simply love this play. I first saw it in Chicago in the late 90s. It was an off-night offering and I can't recall for certain the venue — I think it was one of Steppenwolf's auxiliary spaces... It could have been Victory Gardens. What I know for certain is I and about 20 other patrons who'd never heard of the writer, but wanted to support the director, climbed some narrow stairs and entered an intimate black-box space where we subsequently had our minds blown by this gem that is at once experimental, but also completely accessible. It was a limited run because the actors involved were a big-deal and all the theaters in town wanted to work with them. The show ended up getting extended around the actors' schedules — meaning sometimes the play would run at II pm on a random Wednesday. And I'd go. I ended up seeing it 4 times. That's how I came to fall in love with Daniel Maclvor. This is my second time directing the piece. When I first joined the Fist in 2004 I pitched it for a Directors Fest and it made me look so super-smart that I was named Literary Manager.


