On Three Tables by Murray Mednick

In his work for the stage Murray has always followed the artist's creed to "make it new." In his six decades writing for the stage this has meant finding some new technical challenge to guide his curiosity about the expressive capacities of actors on stage speaking to one another. With *Three Tables* that challenge involves the capacity of everyday dinner-table conversation to reveal, through the musical interplay of thought, emotion and embodiment, something refined about the human situation. The musicality here has to do with timing, the aspect of dialogue that links Murray to the be-bop musicians—Miles, Charlie Parker, Artie Shaw—he listened to as a young man working in restaurants in the Catskills and writing poetry. Occupying our present moment, Joe and Saul serve chow to their dinner guests, having updated versions of the kinds of exchanges people would have had back then as a matter of course. The experience of emotional pain, the meaning of love, the nature of anti-Semitism, along with insights about Kabbalah—through a symphonic weave of everyday intelligence the play transports us into a timeless present, and then speaks sobering truths about the arrival of fascism in the US of A. While enjoying colorful characters sharing time on an evening out on the town, we look down from the play's magic carpet to see a darkness creeping across the land.

Other Mednick-ites in the audience will recognize in *Three Tables* traces of Murray's play *Fedunn*. Written in the 1990s and directed with memorable precision by Mitch Ryan at the Odyssey in 2004. A close friend of Murray's, Ryan recently passed away, and this production strikes me as a fitting eulogy for their shared interest in the transformative impact of meeting the demands of the moment on stage and off. *Fedunn* also featured exquisite timing around the serving of diners in a restaurant amid conversations about the destruction of European Jewry at the hands of the Nazis. That same monster has learned to speak American now, and *Three Tables* calls it out and shines a light through the language ordinary people exchange as they tend in a civilized way to their biological need for a good meal.

Actually, the characters in *Three Tables* are not quite ordinary—rather, they are theatre people. This allows Murray to comment, obliquely and directly, on how the art of theatre pertains to the fuckery at large in our world. Fascism is always a shitty production enrolling people without taste to perform their dark fantasies against those who make them feel inadequate. The play laments the re-mounting of an especially degrading spectacle, and it does so with humor, pathos and, of course, exquisite timing. *Three Tables* celebrates our capacity to not indulge the collapsive imperatives of our reptilian brainstem, but rather to meet the moment with wit and even, perhaps a modicum of grace.

It is remarkable to find an artist of Murray's stature able to bring a lifetime of technique to bear with such force and clarity as he enters his ninth decade on planet earth. For anyone who loves the fine art of theatre, *Three Tables* is a feast.

PRODUCTION BIOS

MURRAY MEDNICK (Playwright/Director) Murray Mednick is a pioneer of the Off and Off-Off Broadway movements in the '60s and '70s and was playwright-in-residence at Theater Genesis. He wrote such groundbreaking works as *The Hawk* (NY), *The Hunter* (NY), *Sand* (NY), Are You Lookin' (NY), Scar (LA; starring Ed Harris), Coyote Cycle (LA) and The Deer Kill (NY) (1970 OBIE Award for Outstanding Play), and was the founder/artistic director of the Padua Hills Playwrights Workshop/Festival in Los Angeles from 1978 to 1995. Murray is the recipient of two Rockefeller Foundation grants and a Guggenheim Fellowship, an American Theatre Critics Association Best New Play citation (for *Joe and Betty*), a Career Achievement Award from the LA Weekly, an Ovation Lifetime Achievement Award for Outstanding Contributions to Los Angeles Theater from the LA Stage Alliance, a Local Hero Award from Backstage West, and the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle's Margaret Harford Award for Sustained Excellence in Theater. "As Murray Mednick experiments with language... he is emblematic of a Los Angeles dramatic tradition in much the same way that Clifford Odets is identifiable with Gotham or David Mamet with Chicago," wrote Bob Verini in Variety. Mednick's most recent production of his play, Villon, was nominated for "Best New Play" by the Stage Raw committee in 2015. In 2017, Open Fist Theatre Company produced Murray Mednick's *The Gary Plays* (eight plays) which premiered in May-June at the Atwater Theatre in Los Angeles, California, *The Gary Plays* were nominated for four 2017 Ovation Awards. In 2018, Mednick's play Mayakovsky and Stalin received its World Premiere in Los Angeles to critical acclaim. It was produced Off-Broadway in 2019 at The Cherry Lane Theatre. Produced in conjunction with Padua Playwrights, *Three Tables* is Mednick's latest play.

RACQUEL LEHRMAN, THEATRE PLANNERS (*Producer*) Racquel is the founder and managing director of Theatre Planners, her own bi-coastal theatre production firm which has been serving the New York and Los Angeles theatre scenes for over fifteen years. She graduated from NYU-Tisch School of the Arts and lived in NY for many years producing theatre. Theatre Planners has since developed into a very busy and successful outlet for actors, writers, producers and theatre companies.
