






To elevate, educate, and entertain audiences of all ages by presenting thought-provoking classics, socially relevant plays, and education programs in a natural outdoor sanctuary for the arts.



By passing on a sense of history to young people and adults alike, great works of art inform their present and inspire their future. A true renaissance theatre, we offer accessible, diverse, and multi-faceted programming, from Shakespeare to poetry to folk music to the development of future playwrights – all to help understand the world we live in and to embrace our shared humanity.

THEATRICUM HISTORY



The seeds of Theatricum Botanicum were planted in the early 1950s when Will Geer and his wife Herta Ware built a performance space on their Topanga property as a refuge for fellow blacklisted artists victimized by the McCarthy Era injustices. Will, who also held a master's degree in horticulture from the University of Chicago, cultivated a large garden and orchard, earning a living with his family by selling vegetables, fruit, and herbs. In 1973, following the success of The Waltons television series and his popular portrayal of "Grandpa," the veteran actor gathered family members (who by then were working in theatres across the country) to form a nonprofit corporation, Will Geer's Theatricum Botanicum. What began as a small band of players working towards becoming a professional repertory theatre, soon became an even larger enterprise incorporating arts education and musical events.

Education has been central to Theatricum's mission and values since its inception 50 years ago. In 1978, the School Days Field Trip program began offering students and classroom teachers an opportunity to travel to Theatricum's outdoor venue for a day including workshops and a professional production of a Shakespeare play.





Our Youth Programs, from age 4-teens, shortly followed providing year-round private classes and summer camps that engage them with the classics and teach cooperation and confidence through ensemble, voice, movement, music, dance, and acting techniques.





Classroom Enrichment was added in 1990 to bring Theatricum to the schools. Working with diverse school partners, Theatricum develops and delivers the highest quality arts education programming including Assemblies, Workshops, and Residencies all supporting coverage of core curriculum.



Combined, Theatricum's education programs serve over 15,000 PK-12th grade students each year with students from every corner of the greater Los Angeles region encompassing virtually every type of school or household. We are deeply proud of the diversity of our educational community. Our actors have become the very teachers who carry on our methods and techniques, from performing the works of Shakespeare to those of a student's own writings mounted on the stage. This ongoing mentorship opens their imaginations to realize the gifts they have, and how they may contribute to society.

Theatricum's contributions to the professional theatre and performance community are equally integral. In addition, for over a decade, the Professional Acting and Apprenticeship programs have provided training and hands-on experience to adults each summer seeking to hone their craft. The Academy of the Classics that serves adults provides the highest quality professional training in audition prep, scene work, text analysis, improvisation, voice rhetoric, movement, and more.







Of course, the heart of Theatricum has always been its Repertory Company which is proudly celebrating its 50th anniversary this season. Each year the company performs a variety of plays which include our requisite Shakespeare productions but also classics from theatre's beloved masters and contemporary pieces which speak to the social conscience of our modern world.







Since the very beginning we have been blessed by the help of our unique circle of 'friends'. The local and surrounding communities encouraged the theatre's artistic goals and proved their support by donating the labor and materials to begin a campaign to expand and improve the theatre's facilities.

In 1984, parents from the Topanga Preschool, using wooden planks salvaged from the old Santa Monica pier, constructed the main stage. In 2001, Theatricum inaugurated a second educational and performance space, the S. Mark Taper Foundation Youth Pavilion, an 88-seat pavilion which provided a much-needed home for the theatre's burgeoning youth programs. Its intimate stage has also been an ideal setting for the Under the Oaks series offering stimulating performances of words and music under the stars... and evenings of laughter and frivolity with our resident improv troupe, Off the Grid.





This new decade has already brought exciting changes, in 2020 with a grant from the Ahmanson Foundation, we were able to replace and rejuvenate the worn main stage, audience seating and Tiring House which had served us well for decades of plays, concerts, events...and the outdoor elements. The S. Mark Taper Foundation produced our 2020 & 2021 seasons to see us through the difficult COVID period.





In 2022 an LA County grant, addressing climate change, enabled vast improvements to the sustainability of the grounds including the revitalization of the creek and the planting of native plants. Take a moment and visit the spectacular mural painted on the bridge and the plaque commemorating the work in the picnic area. And soon the historic Woody Guthrie shack will be renovated as a museum to house the family's collection of artifacts and tell the story of Theatricum's beginnings with exhibits, and workshops.





As we begin our 50th Reparatory Season, we have already received an outpouring of appreciation and recognition from our surrounding communities and constant supporters. This spring, Theatricum received a Congressional award for 50 years of service from our Congressman, Brad Sherman. We are so grateful to all of you who have been a part of our marvelous history...and we look forward to sharing these coming years with you as we 'carry it on' towards the fulfillment the original dream of our founders. INDIGENOUS LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Will Geer's Theatricum Botanicum acknowledges that we gather on the unceded ancestral lands past, present and future of the Chumash [CHOO-mash], the Fernandeño Tataviam [fernan-DAY-nyo ta-ta-VEE-am], and Gabrielino Tongva [TONE-gva] (also called the Kizh [keech] Nation, kizh being the word for home in the Gabrielino/Tongva language). We honor with gratitude the land itself and the people who have stewarded it throughout the generations. For those of us who are not Indigenous to this land, we must acknowledge the lasting impact of the California genocide on its native peoples. This calls us to commit to continuing to learn how to be better stewards of the land we are honored to inhabit as well.



Director's Notes:

Theatricum and *A Midsummer Night's Dream* have been a marriage since our inception 50 years ago. Our canopy of Coastal Live Oaks demand we perform this play for them! And we do! This year, 2023, we will infuse the beautiful language of Shakespeare with more song and music to heighten the pleasure for you, our audience, and our beautiful trees where magic is hidden.

Three separate worlds unfold: First, the elegant court of Duke Theseus and his betrothed Amazon, Hippolyta, where a father's tyranny drives passionate young lovers to escape into the forest outside Athens. Next, we meet some tradespeople, "hard-handed men" of the town, planning to perform a theatrical piece at the royal wedding. Last is the fairy kingdom where Oberon and Titania battle over a human child. Oberon's jealousy and its resultant turmoil ignite chaos in the human world by turning nature's seasons upside down

A Midsummer Night's Dream blossoms in Theatricum Botanicum (theatre in the garden). There are more plants mentioned in this play than in any other of Shakespeare's plays, and through the years it's not surprising that Dream returns to our stage time and again. It appeals to all ages and is the ideal introduction to the Bard's wonderful world of language, character, and storytelling. Classical actors pursue this play again and again throughout their careers, striving, like Bottom, to play all the parts.


What makes those that rule make war not love, Within their wealthy isolated world? A petty universe that works alone, Ignoring the needs of those they supposedly govern?



Director's Notes:

How do we forgive ourselves? For our shortcomings, our past, our regrets? How do we come to terms with life's tragedies, especially when we blame ourselves, and that blame is not entirely misplaced?

In Terrence McNally's poetic and magical play "A Perfect Ganesh" we travel with two upper class Connecticut white women to India, both of whom have lost their sons, and both of whom are somewhat culpable in their deaths. As they search, in their unique ways for "reconciliation, renewal, and rebirth" they are accompanied by Lord Ganesh himself, the remover of all obstacles.

Their journey is at once both geographical and deeply internal as they wrestle with their failings as wives, mothers, and friends. Through their journey McNally incriminates the unforgiving prejudices, the superficiality, the emotional denial, and cultural superiorities embedded in contemporary American culture that can lead towards total personal destruction if not tempered with insight, searing truth, and compassion. And at the same time, he humorously skewers the orientalist, colonialist stereotype of the Western 'seeker' finding solace in 'trips to India,' rather than simply facing themselves where they are. After all, Dorothy, "there's no place like home."

McNally asks us all how we can each find redemption as we collectively drown in the mire of individual and societal failings. Written and produced for the first time in 1993, his work was remarkably prescient considering the new and even deeper cultural crisis and reexaminations we are now confronting as Americans. Does this journey ever end?
