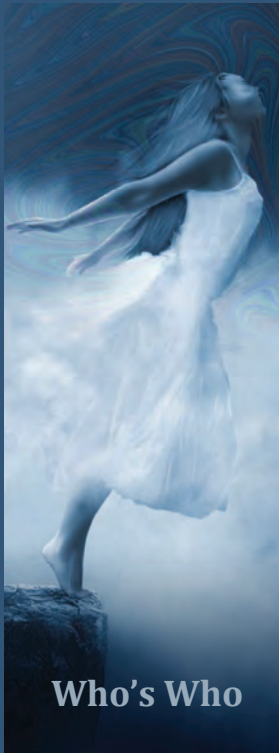

at the Young Actors studio and chasing the sweet sound of laughter with his sketch group SketchULater, Hogan is repped commercially by CESD Talent.

PRODUCTION TEAM

Garry Michael Kluger (Playwright/Associate Producer/Sound Designer) Garry has authored three books, nineteen plays, two TV pilots, twelve documentaries, and several series. *Walking In Space* is his 2nd full-length play to be produced at Theatre West. Garry likes to refer to this play as his non-fictional, fiction play since events in the play detail actual events from his teenage years. Garry's first play for Theatre West, *A Thorn In The Family Paw*, won Best New Play from the Stage Scene L.A. Awards, and Garry won Best Writer-Original Play, from the Valley Theatre Awards. He has won the DFAP International One Act Festival for "The Other Half," and the Gold Award for "Office Hours" and the Silver Award for *In A Yellow Wood* from the World Series Of Screenwriting. He's also won Highly Recommended from the Segora Playwrights Festival in France for *Prodigal Returns*, and was twice a finalist from the Sterts Theatre in London for his one acts, *The Other Half* and *Brotherhood*.

Arden Teresa Lewis

(Director/Costume Designer) Arden's first feature documentary film, *Leveling Lincoln*, just launched on the PBS APP and is distributed by NETA for TV broadcast as of May 2023. Her script, *Gravel Road*, was a 2022 semi-finalist at the Ojai Film Festival, a finalist at Big Apple Film Fest and the Lady Filmmakers Festival in Beverly Hills among others. She collaborates often with the playwright, Garry Michael Kluger, including the critically acclaimed *A Thorn In The Family Paw* and is thrilled to be helming *Walking In Space* in 2023. She directed *The Night Forlorn, or Waitin' on Godsford*, which won Best Production of a Play at the 2018 Valley Theatre Awards. She has acted OFF Broadway at

Primary Stages, The Bouwerie Lane Theatre, Soho Playhouse, regionally at the Paper Mill Playhouse and the La Mirada Civic Theatre. She received the Lilian Nesburn Award from the Beverly Hills Theatre Guild for her play, *Grandma Good* and was a semi-finalist for the Jane Chambers Award with her play, *Baby Dreams*, which was published in TCG Magazine. Her play, *Little Rhonda*, was produced at Theatre Geo and is part of the Audrey Skirball Kenis Theater Archives at the Los Angeles Central Library. Published in two anthologies: *Scenes For Women By Women* and *Even More Monologues For Women By Women*. Her other long-time partner and collaborator is her husband, director and magician, Charlie Mount. Spring Awakening, which went on to a Tony-nominated Broadway run. She has served on the boards of directors of the Los Angeles Theatre Alliance, Women in Theatre and P.A.T.H. (Performing Arts Theatre for the Handicapped).

Doug Haverty (Graphic Design) Doug has designed for theaters and performing arts worldwide, including creating 500 package designs (LP, CD, DVD, Blu-Ray, Box-Sets) for Universal, Warner Bros., EMI and Sony, among others, for the likes of James Brown, David Cassidy, Lucie Arnaz, Petula Clark, Amanda McBroom, Tom Wopat, Sam Harris, Melora Hardin, Dixie Carter, "Weird Al" Yankovic, Jefferson Starship and many more. PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE

This may come as a surprise to some people, but drug addiction is not new. In fact, addiction is probably as old as time itself.

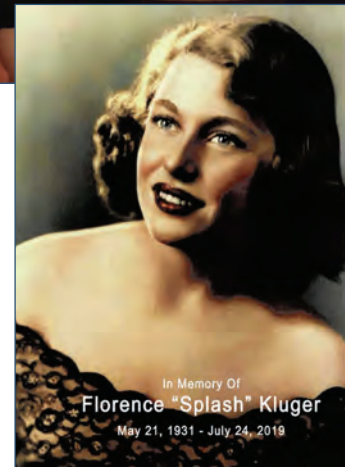
While *Walking in Space* doesn't go back to the beginning of time (only 1972), its theme is ancient: drug addiction hurts all it touches. Though I am not now, nor have I ever been, addicted to drugs, I do have personal knowledge of the pain it can bring. The intent of the play is not to redefine or even rehash the definition or implications of drug addiction. I believe they are quite well known. My purpose was to freeze a moment in time to show how one particular drug addiction almost took down an entire family.

I'm sure most of you know, or have known, someone like Franny Silberman. (I certainly have!) And hopefully you also know that addiction, in whatever form, is not a "death sentence." It could be, but doesn't have to be. It can be beaten. It takes, faith, love, support and, most importantly, professional help. One does not have to go through this struggle alone. Help is always there. But you do have to ask for it -- whether for yourself or for someone you care about. Addiction is a disease. But like many diseases, it can be overcome. Take it from someone who's seen it up close.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"The truth was, Librium and Valium were marketed using such a variety of gendered mid-century tropes—the neurotic singleton, the frazzled housewife, the joyless career woman, the menopausal shrew—that what Roche's tranquilizers really seemed to offer was a quick fix for the problem of 'being female.'"

The cast of *Walking in Space* rehearsed this play about addiction all summer as a 6 billion-dollar settlement to protect a pharmaceutical family from lawsuits over OxyContin deaths

played out. I remember decades ago the over-prescribing of "downers" among my friends' parents, mostly among the mothers, to whom these drugs, and others, were directly marketed. The younger members of our cast have made a direct correlation from "mother's little helper" of the 70s to the current opioid crisis and how it has ruined lives in their own generation. The sad reality of decades of mercenary abuse of the public by big pharma is made all too real and

relatable in Garry Michael Kluger's play. I am honored to have the chance to direct it and grateful to have this unique group of actors to portray the truth in this play.

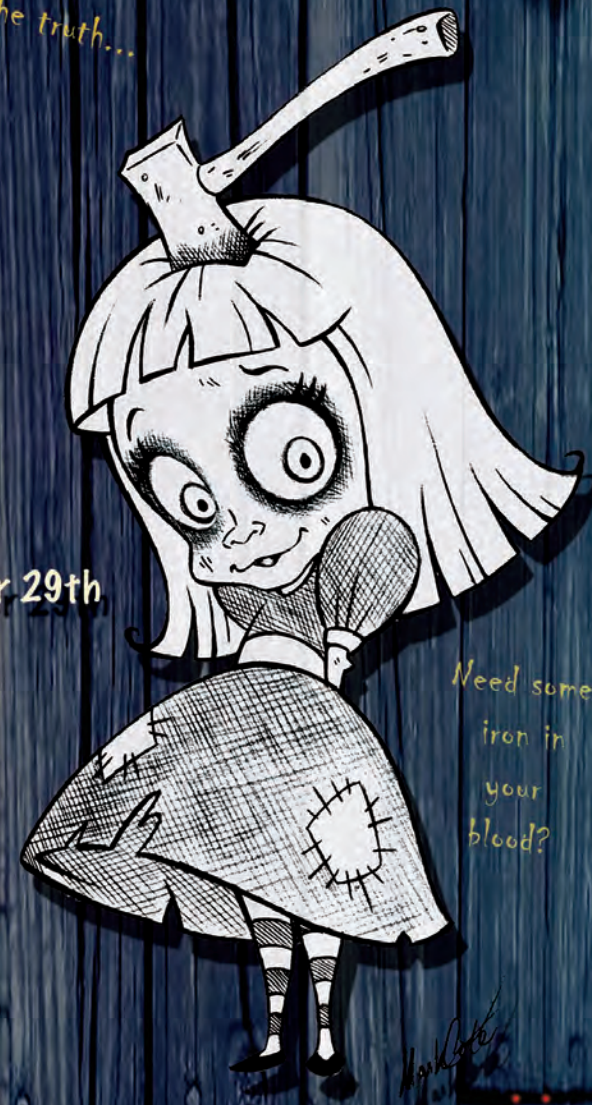
